ABOUT WHITE LAKE, ONTARIO

- Headwater, off-shield, wetland lake that is primarily spring-fed
- Measures 22 square kilometres in area and has a single outlet at the north end
- Located in four municipalities and two counties



HOW TO HELP WHITE LAKE

- Participate in the Natural Edge Program (<u>naturaledge.watersheds.ca</u>) to restore and protect your shoreline using native plants. This will also help reduce nutrient loading into White Lake.
